Against a successful record of achievements in eliminating communicable diseases, in 2019, Member States of the Pan American Health
Organization (PAHO) approved a policy for an integrated and sustainable approach to communicable diseases in the Americas, known as the
Elimination Initiative (EI), but the COVID-19 pandemic hindered actions at regional, national and local level and slowed down the pace towards the
elimination of communicable diseases.

Over the past three years, countries in the Region have been working together to combat the pandemic; many innovative approaches were put in place to ensure continuity in the provision of health services and precious lessons were learned. As countries move into the post-pandemic recovery, the time is right to reposition the EI in the new context, galvanized by recent experiences and firmly focused on inequities in health and on populations in situation of vulnerability.

This session will provide an insightful overview of the Elimination Initiative, its underlying rationale, and the collective efforts to eliminate communicable diseases as a public health concern in the Americas while strengthening the resilience of healthcare services and contributing to pandemic preparedness. Additionally, regional best practices and perspectives from strategic partners will complete the proceedings.
